## Cabela's Outback Lodge six-person tent

Simple to set up, this tent has a single center pole that raises the roof higher than 8 feet. You can actually stand up to put your pants on. A mesh door screen helps with ventilation, while side windows let in plenty of sunlight. There's enough room for two cots and space leftover for gear. \$240, [cabelas.com](http://cabelas.com)



## Backpacker's Pantry Outback Oven

We use this 10-inch oven to bake fresh muffins and cookies at camp. You mix the ingredients in a nonstick frying pan, place a reflective aluminum cap over the top to trap the rising heat, and turn on the flames. ## Zodi Hot Tap On-Demand Hot Shower

When you get off the trail dusty and tired, nothing feels as good as a hot shower. The Zodi uses a propane burner to heat four gallons of water—enough for a 10-minute shower—and pumps it to the showerhead with a 6-volt electric motor that runs on D-cell batteries. \$150, [zodi.com](http://zodi.com)
